#### **Time to Reflect**

In all that we face in these days, know this: we belong to God.

God's people have always from time to time found themselves living in contexts of real fear and uncertainty. Time and time again the message from Scripture meets those moments with the repeated refrain: "Do not fear"; "Be at peace" and in Jesus' words in Matthew's Gospel today, "...remember, I am with you always...".

We desperately need to do that remembering today. When we live with real fear and anxiety about the health of those close to us, or ourselves and at a time when our Church buildings are temporarily closed and we are keeping isolated from one another we feel beset by uncertainty and fear can be overwhelming. We have to come back to that remembering of who we belong to, of the God in Christ who shares the fullness of our human lives.

This week, sadly, the doors of our Church buildings have had to close. But the Church is more than our buildings and our faith in God's presence through these times can be stronger than our fear. We will have to, as one politician put it recently, stand together by pulling a little further apart at this present time. There's a number

of ways we can pull together, in sharing worship separately and yet united in prayer. We can pray wherever we are, for one another, for those who are unwell and anxious around the world and for those seeking to bring healing and hope. You can, if you are well enough and able to do so, sign up as a volunteer to deliver essential items to the doorstep of those unable to get out. You can keep in touch with one another on the phone or via social media. You can always call or email your Minister for pastoral conversations.

This week we mark Mothering Sunday. One theory about the origins of this festival in the middle of the season of Lent is from the 16<sup>th</sup> century practice of returning to the Mother Church, the largest Parish Church or Cathedral in the area. This year, we are unable to visit our local Churches but we recognise more than ever how important that sense of belonging together and belonging to God is for our own continued nurture and support. We should never take that for granted.

I've been thinking a lot this week about two lines of a hymn that speak into this: (STF 682 God of Grace and God of glory): the hymn says at its conclusion: "Grant us wisdom, grant us courage, for the living of these days".

We find courage, even we feel fearful because we know God is with us still.

We find strength to go on because we remember Jesus is with us always. Thanks be to God.

May your Spirit give us all a sense of calmness and peace.
